Dear Mr. Rauschenberg,

the Heidelberger Kunstverein has decided to translate this idea of Rilke's into action, for the occasion of the inauguration of its new building in the summer of 1989. It is therefore our plan to trace the path of "The Color Blue" (our working title) through art and art history, beginning with the Middle Age. and, as far as possible, to present the results in a large-scale exhibition. Chief emphasis will be placed on the art of the 19th and 20th centuries.

Thus we are not primarily interested in putting together as varied as possible a collection of works of art that are blue; instead, we would much rather prod people into giving this heretofore too little illuminated phenomenon some thought. Our goal is to apprehend the meaning of the color blue in each individual work of art, and also to follow the artist's intentions as much as possible. Thus, in addition to comprehensive observations, it will important to discuss the relevance to our theme in each individual instance.

I am preparing the exhibition personally. The extensive exhibition catalogue, is to include among other things an "Appendix", for which Andreas Bee and Christmut Präger are responsible. In this separate section, in the form of a collection of quotations, we would like to give as wide a survey as possible of the opinions of contemporary artists and people familiar with art.

We would be pleased if you would support our project with a discursive contribution of whatever nature. The enclosed questionnaire may serve as a loose, repeat: loose guideline. All advice or indications of any soft will be welcome.
